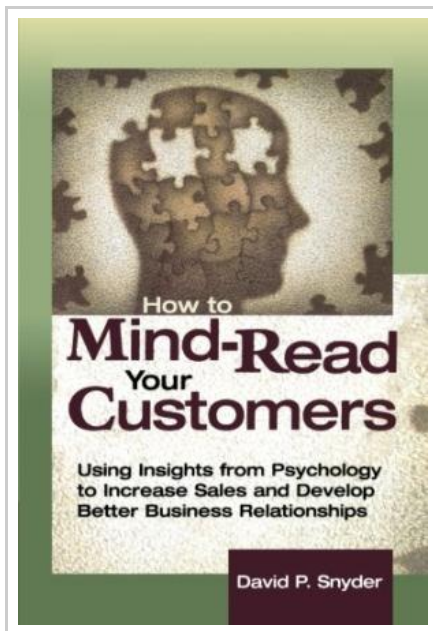




How to Mind-Read Your Customers: Using Insights from Psychology to Increase Sales and Develop Better Business Relationships
